1. I am a foreign citizen / stateless person and I want to enter the Republic of Moldova. Is it possible during the pandemic?

No. Until the first of August, 2020, the entrance on the territory of the Republic of Moldova, through the state border crossing points, is forbidden to foreign citizens and stateless persons, with the following exceptions:

- family members of the citizens of the Republic of Moldova;
- persons in possession of a long-stay visa, a residence permit or a document equivalent to a residence permit issued by the authorities;
- persons travelling in the professional interest, evidenced by a visa, residence permit or other equivalent documents;
- members of diplomatic missions and consular offices accredited in the Republic of Moldova, of international organizations/missions, as well as members of their families or personnel who can provide humanitarian aid;
- persons in transit, including those repatriated as a result of the granting of consular protection. The transit route is established by the General Inspectorate of Border Police (see point 4);
- persons travelling for health and humanitarian reasons, including the accompanying person, as appropriate (with the presentation of confirmatory documents);
- cross-border workers;
 - the drivers and the personnel serving the means of transport, who carry out the transport of the goods, the crews and the service personnel of the aircraft/ships, the brigades, and the service personnel of the train sets.

2. They are part of the category of persons allowed to enter the Republic of Moldova. Do I have to follow a self-isolation regime when entering the country?

Yes. Persons crossing the state border on the way to enter the Republic of Moldova will be required to complete the epidemiological file and will sign the declaration to comply with the self-isolation regime for a period of 14 (fourteen) days in determined places on their own responsibility.

3. Exception from the self-isolation obligation:

In the case of them not showing clinical signs of respiratory infection or fever, the following categories of persons are not obliged to comply with the self-isolation regime for a period of 14 (fourteen) days in the determined places:

- drivers and service personnel of road vehicles for the transport of goods and persons, crews and service personnel of aircraft/ships, brigades and service personnel of train sets;
- persons travelling for health or humanitarian reasons, including the accompanying person, when appropriate (with the presentation of confirmatory documents);
- pupils/students, enrolled in educational units/institutions abroad, who have to take tests or exams at the end of the middle school / high school / higher education cycles;
- persons travelling for professional reasons, proven by visa, residence permit or other confirmatory documents;
- cross-border workers;
- members of diplomatic missions and consular offices accredited in the Republic of Moldova, of international organizations/missions, as well as members of their families or personnel who can provide humanitarian aid;
- persons in transit.

4. What are the conditions established for the transit of the Republic of Moldova?

The transit of the territory of the Republic of Moldova will be carried out directly, without stopping, through the following channels established between the state border crossing points:

- Giurgiulesti Galati, road Giurgiulesti Reni, road;
- Chisinau International Airport, by air Leuseni-Albita, by road;
- Chisinau International Airport, by air Tudora-Starokazacie, by road;

Chisinau International Airport, by air - Palanca-Maiaki - Udobnoe, by road.

These transit channels can be used for transit in both directions. In case of transit, you will receive a document regarding the transit itinerary and the necessary time granted for leaving the Republic of Moldova.

5. I want to come to the Republic of Moldova by land. What are the active state border crossing points?

6. I am in self-isolation at home, but I have to leave the country. May I?

Not. It is forbidden, to leave the territory of the Republic of Moldova for persons in self-isolation at home, until August 1, 2020.

7. What happens if I do not respect the self-isolation regime of the home?

Failure to comply with the self-isolation regime at home will serve as a basis for bringing the guilty person to contravention and/or criminal liability.
